ART ROSS TROPHY

Description

First awarded in 1947-48, the Art Ross Trophy is presented annually “to the player who leads the League in scoring points at the end of the regular season.”

History

Arthur Howey Ross, former manager-coach of the Boston Bruins, presented the Art Ross Trophy to the NHL in 1948. If two or more players finish the regular season with the same number of points, the trophy is awarded based on the following tiebreakers: 1. Player with the most goals, 2. Player with fewer games played, 3. Player scoring first goal of the season.

2019-20 Winner

Edmonton Oilers center **Leon Draisaitl** (43-67—110 in 71 GP) finished 13 points ahead of teammate and two-time scoring champion **Connor McDavid** (34-63—97 in 64 GP) to capture his first career Art Ross Trophy. Draisaitl found the scoresheet in 56 of his 71 appearances (78.9%), powered by a League-best 33 multi-point performances – four more than the next-closest players (**Nathan MacKinnon** and **David Pastrnak**: 29). That included a pair of career-high, five-point outings: March 2 at NSH (4-1—5) and Nov. 14 vs. COL (0-5—5). Draisaitl also topped the NHL in assists (67), power-play points (44) and game-winning goals (t-10) while ranking in the top five in the League in power-play goals (2nd; 16), power-play assists (2nd; 28), shooting percentage (3rd; 19.7%) and goals (4th; 43). The 24-year-old Cologne native became the first German-born player to win the Art Ross Trophy. He and McDavid (2017-18 and 2016-17) have combined for three of the past four NHL scoring titles, making the Oilers the first team to achieve the feat since the Pittsburgh Penguins claimed seven straight from 1994-95 through 2000-01 (**Jaromir Jagr**: 5x, **Mario Lemieux**: 2x).

BILL MASTERTON MEMORIAL TROPHY

Description

First awarded in 1967-68, the Bill Masterton Memorial Trophy is presented annually “to the player who best exemplifies the qualities of perseverance, sportsmanship and dedication to hockey.”

Voting

Local chapters of the Professional Hockey Writers Association submit nominations for the Bill Masterton Memorial Trophy at the conclusion of the regular season, with the top three vote-getters designated as finalists.

History

The Bill Masterton Memorial Trophy was presented by the NHL Writers’ Association in 1968 to commemorate the late **Bill Masterton**, a player with the Minnesota North Stars who exhibited to a high degree the qualities of perseverance, sportsmanship and dedication to hockey and who died on Jan. 15, 1968, as a result of an on-ice injury.

Bill Masterton Memorial Scholarship Fund

A \$2,500 grant from the PHWA is awarded annually to the Bill Masterton Memorial Scholarship Fund, based in Bloomington, Minn., in the name of the trophy winner.

2019-20 Finalists

Stephen Johns, D, Dallas Stars

Johns returned to NHL action in 2019-20 after being sidelined for 22 months due to post-traumatic headaches, [an ordeal he described to The Athletic](#). Following a two-game conditioning stint with Texas of the American Hockey League, Johns returned against the Minnesota Wild on Jan. 18 (his previous NHL game was against the Wild on March 29, 2018) and played 18:29. The 28-year-old defenseman went on to appear in 17 games during the regular season, recording 2-3--5. A season highlight was scoring his first goal since returning [with his parents in attendance at Madison Square Garden](#). “Throughout this whole process, it wasn’t just me going through hell,” Johns [told the Dallas Morning News](#). “As parents, they want to help and for them to be here and see that, I probably know my dad was for sure crying. I’m pretty excited to go see them and give them both a big hug.”

Oskar Lindblom, LW, Philadelphia Flyers

In December 2019, Lindblom was diagnosed with Ewing’s sarcoma, a rare type of bone cancer, by leading specialists at the University of Pennsylvania and started treatment that sidelined him for the remainder of the regular season. Prior to the diagnosis, Lindblom was in the midst of a breakout campaign, recording 11 goals, which was tied for the team lead at the time, and 18 points (11G-7A) in 30 games. The hockey world celebrated on July 2 when the 24-year-old forward [rang a ceremonial bell](#) at Abramson Cancer Center at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia to signify the end of his treatments. “He’s handled it much better than I probably would,” Flyers teammate **Kevin Hayes** [told the Philadelphia Inquirer](#). “It’s inspiring, and he puts a smile to your face and makes you realize your problems aren’t as serious as they seem to be.”

Bobby Ryan, RW, Ottawa Senators

Ryan, 33, left the Senators to enter the NHL/NHLPA player assistance program on Nov. 20. He returned to practice with the team in early February and pledged to share his story publicly in an effort to help and inspire others facing similar challenges. In his first home game after returning to the lineup Ryan [tallied a hat trick, was named the game’s First Star and received multiple standing ovations](#) in a 5-2 win over the Vancouver Canucks on Feb. 27. “Because I’ve been open and candid about that, I think people have looked at me and said, ‘There’s a very relatable person,’” Ryan [told the Ottawa Sun](#). “Through my family stuff and now with alcohol issues, I’ve never hid from it and I’ve always said, if I’m going to do this, I’m going to have to do it in the public eye and I’m going to have to be candid with it.”

CALDER MEMORIAL TROPHY

Description

First awarded in 1932-33, the Calder Memorial Trophy is presented annually “to the player selected as the most proficient in his first year of competition.”

Voting

Members of the Professional Hockey Writers Association submit ballots for the Calder Memorial Trophy at the conclusion of the regular season, with the top three vote-getters designated as finalists.

History

From 1936-37 until his death in 1943, NHL President **Frank Calder** purchased a trophy each year to be given permanently to the League’s outstanding rookie. After Calder’s death, the NHL presented the Calder Memorial Trophy in his memory.

Eligibility

To be eligible for the Calder Memorial Trophy, a player cannot have played more than 25 games in any single preceding season nor in six or more games in each of any two preceding seasons in any major professional league. Beginning in 1990-91, a player must not have attained his 26th birthday by Sept. 15 of the season in which he is eligible.

2019-20 Finalists

Quinn Hughes, D, Vancouver Canucks

Hughes posted 8-45—53 in 68 games to become the third defenseman in the NHL’s modern era (since 1943-44) to top all rookies in scoring (outright or tied), joining **Brian Leetch** (1988-89 w/ NYR) and **Bobby Orr** (1966-67 w/ BOS). His 53 points were the most by any rookie blueliner since 1991-92, when **Nicklas Lidstrom** compiled 11-49—60 in 80 appearances (w/ DET), and three shy of **Dale Tallon**’s single-season franchise record for a rookie defenseman, set in 10 more games in 1970-71 (14-42—56 in 78 GP). Hughes also led all 2019-20 rookies in assists (45), power-play assists (22) and power-play points (25), while ranking among the top five in average time on ice (2nd; 21:53), total time on ice (2nd; 1,488:09) and shots on goal (5th; 126). The 20-year-old Orlando, Fla., native is looking to become the second straight Canucks player to claim the Calder Trophy, following **Elias Pettersson** in 2018-19. The last team to boast consecutive Calder Trophy winners was the Boston Bruins, in 1966-67 (Orr) and 1967-68 (**Derek Sanderson**).

Dominik Kubalik, LW, Chicago Blackhawks

Kubalik led all rookies with 30 goals in 68 games (30-16—46), making him the fifth rookie in Blackhawks history to reach the 30-goal milestone after **Steve Larmer** (43 in 1982-83), **Darryl Sutter** (40 in 1980-81), **Eric Daze** (30 in 1995-96) and **Artemi Panarin** (30 in 2015-16). The 25-year-old Plzen, Czech Republic, native became the first Czech-born player in NHL history to pace rookies in goals as well as the third to reach the 30-goal plateau, joining **Petr Klima** (32 in 1985-86) and **Petr Prucha** (30 in 2005-06). Kubalik, who topped all 2019-20 rookies and ranked seventh in the entire NHL with a 19.1 shooting percentage, also placed among the top 10 freshmen in shots on goal (1st; 157), points (3rd; 46), power-play goals (t-6th; 4), game-winning goals (t-6th; 3), assists (t-9th; 16) and power-play points (t-10th; 8). He is vying to become the first Czech-born player to earn the Calder Trophy as well as the 10th Blackhawks player to capture the award, following recent winners Panarin (2015-16) and **Patrick Kane** (2007-08).

Cale Makar, D, Colorado Avalanche

Makar, who burst onto the scene in the 2019 Stanley Cup Playoffs by scoring [the winning goal in his League debut](#), continued to make waves in his first full NHL season, topping rookies with 0.88 points per game (12-38—50 in 57 GP). Only three other rookie blueliners in NHL history have averaged as many points per game in a single season (minimum: 50 GP): Leetch (1.04 in 1988-89 w/ NYR), **Larry Murphy** (0.95 in 1980-81 w/ LAK) and **Al MacInnis** (0.88 in 1983-84 w/ CGY). Makar also finished among the 2019-20 rookie leaders in game-winning goals (t-1st; 4), assists (2nd; 38), points (2nd; 50), power-play assists (2nd; 15), power-play points (2nd; 19), average time on ice (3rd; 21:01), goals (6th; 12), power-play goals (t-6th; 4), plus/minus (7th; +12), shots on goal (8th; 121) and shooting percentage (8th; 9.9%). The 21-year-old Calgary native is seeking to become the sixth player in Avalanche/Nordiques history to capture the Calder Trophy and fourth since the franchise relocated to Colorado, following **Nathan MacKinnon** (2013-14), **Gabriel Landeskog** (2011-12) and **Chris Drury** (1998-99).

Patrice Bergeron, C, Boston Bruins

Bergeron (31-25—56 in 61 GP) helped the Bruins allow a League-low 174 goals en route to finishing atop the overall NHL standings for the 14th time in franchise history (and first time since 2013-14). He led Boston forwards in shifts per game (22.9), playing an average of 18:44 – including 1:43 on the penalty kill – while finishing 15th in the NHL in plus/minus (+23). Bergeron also ranked among the top 10 in the League in face-off wins (5th; 759) and face-off winning percentage (6th; 57.9%), the 11th consecutive season he has eclipsed the 56-percent plateau. The 35-year-old Ancienne-Lorette, Que., native is a Selke Trophy finalist for a record ninth straight season, extending his own mark in that category. Bergeron’s four Selke wins (2011-12, 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2016-17) are tied for the most in NHL history with **Bob Gainey**, who captured the trophy each of the first four years it was awarded (1978-81 w/ MTL).

Sean Couturier, C, Philadelphia Flyers

Couturier (22-37—59 in 69 GP) paced the NHL by winning 59.6 percent of his face-offs (542-for-909). Only one player in Flyers history has recorded a higher single-season total (since the statistic began being tracked in 1997-98, minimum: 500 FO): **Eric Lindros** in both 1997-98 (60.1%) and 1998-99 (60.0%). Couturier was consistent throughout the ice, winning 59.5 percent of his face-offs in the defensive zone, 60.4 percent in the neutral zone and 59.1 percent in the offensive zone – no other NHL player topped 58 percent in all three zones. Couturier also led all Philadelphia skaters with a +21 rating while pacing team forwards in both total time on ice (1,368:23) and shorthanded time on ice (140:29). The 27-year-old – who finished second in Selke Trophy voting in 2017-18 – is vying to become the third player to win the award with the Flyers, following **Dave Poulin** (1986-87) and **Bobby Clarke** (1982-83).

Ryan O'Reilly, C, St. Louis Blues

O'Reilly (12-49—61 in 71 GP) – the reigning Selke Trophy winner – led the NHL in face-off victories (880) for the third consecutive season, making him the third player to achieve that feat since the statistic was introduced in 1997-98 (joining Bergeron: 4x from 2014-17 and **Rod Brind'Amour**: 3x from 2004-07). O'Reilly also topped the League in percentage of team face-offs taken (38.7%) while ranking 10th in face-off winning percentage (56.6%), the fifth straight season he has cleared the 55-percent mark. O'Reilly, who also is a Lady Byng Memorial Trophy finalist, finished seventh in the League with 69 takeaways while only taking five minor penalties in 1,460:45 of total playing time, 10th among NHL forwards. The 29-year-old Clinton, Ont., native is seeking to become the first repeat Selke Trophy winner since Bergeron took home the award in both 2013-14 and 2014-15.

HART MEMORIAL TROPHY

Description

First awarded in 1923-24, the Hart Memorial Trophy is presented annually “to the player adjudged to be the most valuable to his team.”

Voting

Members of the Professional Hockey Writers Association submit ballots for the Hart Memorial Trophy at the conclusion of the regular season, with the top three vote-getters designated as finalists.

History

The Hart Memorial Trophy was presented by the NHL in 1960 after the original Hart Trophy was retired to the Hockey Hall of Fame. The original Hart Trophy was donated to the League in 1924 by **Dr. David A. Hart**, father of **Cecil Hart**, former manager-coach of the Montreal Canadiens.

2019-20 Finalists

Leon Draisaitl, C, Edmonton Oilers

Draisaitl (43-67—110 in 71 GP) – who became the first German-born player to win the Art Ross Trophy – topped the NHL with 110 points, 13 more than the next-closest player (**Connor McDavid**: 97). He registered at least one point in 56 of his 71 appearances, the highest such percentage in the League (78.9%) ahead of **Artemi Panarin** (78.3%) and **Patrick Kane** (77.1%). Draisaitl also recorded a League-best 33 multi-point performances, four more than **Nathan MacKinnon** and **David Pastrnak** (29), and led NHL forwards in both total (1,605:24) and average time on ice (22:37). Draisaitl, who reached the 100-point milestone for the second consecutive season (50-55—105 in 2018-19), paced all 2019-20 players in assists (67), power-play points (44) and game-winning goals (t-10) while also ranking among the top five in power-play goals (2nd; 16), power-play assists (2nd; 28), shooting percentage (3rd; 19.7%) and goals (4th; 43). The 24-year-old Cologne native is vying to become the first German-born player to win the Hart Trophy. He also is seeking to become the fourth player to capture the award with the Oilers, following McDavid (2016-17), **Mark Messier** (1989-90) and **Wayne Gretzky** (8x, most recently 1986-87).

Nathan MacKinnon, C, Colorado Avalanche

MacKinnon ranked fifth in the NHL with 35-58—93 in 69 games to power the Avalanche (42-20-8, .657) to their third straight playoff appearance on the strength of the third-highest points percentage in the League. MacKinnon recorded 43 more points than his next-closest teammate (**Cale Makar**: 50), the largest differential between a team's top two scorers since the 2007-08 Washington Capitals (**Alex Ovechkin**: 112, **Nicklas Backstrom**: 69). That total was aided by a 13-game, season-opening point streak (Oct. 3 – Nov. 1: 8-10—18), the longest such run by an Avalanche/Nordiques player since 1992-93 (**Mats Sundin**: 30 GP). Overall, MacKinnon finished the campaign among the League leaders in shots on goal (1st; 318), power-play points (4th; 31), assists (6th; 58), power-play goals (t-6th; 12), goals (9th; 35) and power-play assists (t-10th; 19). The 25-year-old Halifax, N.S., native – who placed second in voting in 2017-18 – is looking to become the third Avalanche/Nordiques player to claim the Hart Trophy, after **Peter Forsberg** (2002-03) and **Joe Sakic** (2000-01).

Artemi Panarin, LW, New York Rangers

Playing his first season in New York, Panarin established a career high and ranked fourth in the NHL with 32-63—95 to help the Rangers (37-28-5, 79 points) improve their year-over-year point total despite playing 12 fewer games (32-36-14, 78 points in 2018-19). Panarin – who finished 20 points ahead of his next-closest teammate (**Mika Zibanejad**: 75) – found the scoresheet in 54 of his 69 appearances (78.3%), during which New York posted a 34-16-4 record (3-12-1 when he failed to register a point/DNP). He topped the League in even-strength assists (46) and even-strength points (71) while placing second in both assists (t-63) and plus/minus (+36). Panarin also played a career-high 20:36 per game, including 3:44 on the power play, while logging a career-low 20 penalty minutes. The 28-year-old Korkino, Russia, native and 2015-16 Calder Memorial Trophy winner (w/ CHI) is New York's first Hart Trophy finalist since 2011-12, when **Henrik Lundqvist** finished third in voting. He is vying to become the fifth Rangers player to win the Hart Trophy and second to do so in the expansion era (since 1967-68), following Messier in 1991-92.

JACK ADAMS AWARD

Description

First awarded in 1973-74, the Jack Adams Award is presented annually “to the coach adjudged to have contributed the most to his team’s success.”

Voting

Members of the NHL Broadcasters’ Association submit ballots for the Jack Adams Award at the conclusion of the regular season, with the top three vote-getters designated as finalists.

History

The Jack Adams Award was presented by the NHL Broadcasters’ Association in 1974 in honor of the late **Jack Adams**, longtime coach and general manager of the Detroit Red Wings.

2019-20 Finalists

Bruce Cassidy, Boston Bruins

Under Cassidy, the Bruins (44-14-12 in 70 GP) topped the NHL in both points (100) and points percentage (.714) to claim the Presidents’ Trophy as the NHL’s best team during the regular season. Boston posted a League-best 44 wins, including 22 victories as both hosts (22-4-9) and visitors (22-10-3). The Bruins, who reached the 40-win milestone for the seventh consecutive season, also posted an NHL-best +53 goal differential while ranking in the top three in both power play (2nd; 25.2%) and penalty kill (3rd; 84.3%) efficiency. Cassidy is a Jack Adams finalist for the second time in the past three seasons, finishing as runner-up to Vegas’ **Gerard Gallant** in 2017-18. He is vying to become the fourth Bruins coach to capture Jack Adams honors, following **Claude Julien** (2008-09), **Pat Burns** (1997-98) and **Don Cherry** (1975-76),

John Tortorella, Columbus Blue Jackets

Tortorella guided Columbus to a .579 points percentage at the time of the pause (33-22-15), landing in the Eastern Conference Stanley Cup Qualifiers as the No. 9-ranked team. The Blue Jackets recorded points in 33 of their final 41 games after Dec. 8 (22-8-11), highlighted by a pair of double-digit point streaks in that span: 12 games (8-0-4 from Dec. 9 to Jan. 2) and 10 games (9-0-1 from Jan. 11 to Feb. 7). Columbus committed the fewest minor penalties in the NHL (180 in 70 GP), tied for second in the League in shutouts (7) and had an NHL-high seven skaters score their first career regular-season goal. Tortorella has garnered a Jack Adams finalist berth for the fifth time; he is a two-time winner of the award (2003-04 with Tampa Bay, 2016-17 with Columbus) and has finished second twice (2002-03 with Tampa Bay, 2011-12 with NY Rangers).

Alain Vigneault, Philadelphia Flyers

In his first season behind the Philadelphia bench, Vigneault led the Flyers to a .645 points percentage (41-21-7) at the pause, their best since a .646 mark in 2010-11 and third-best in 30 years. The Flyers vaulted into the No. 4 seed in the Eastern Conference and a spot in the seeding Round Robin of the Stanley Cup Qualifiers with a nine-game winning streak from Feb. 18 to March 7, eight of which were decided in regulation. Vigneault is a Jack Adams finalist for the fifth time, with his fourth different team. He captured the award in 2006-07 with Vancouver and finished second in 1999-00 with Montreal, 2010-11 with Vancouver and 2014-15 with NY Rangers. He is vying to become the fifth Flyers coach to capture Jack Adams honors, following **Bill Barber** (2000-01), **Mike Keenan** (1984-85), **Pat Quinn** (1979-80) and **Fred Shero** (1973-74).

JAMES NORRIS MEMORIAL TROPHY

Description

First awarded in 1953-54, the James Norris Memorial Trophy is presented annually “to the defense player who demonstrates throughout the season the greatest all-round ability in the position.”

Voting

Members of the Professional Hockey Writers Association submit ballots for the James Norris Memorial Trophy at the conclusion of the regular season, with the top three vote-getters designated as finalists.

History

The James Norris Memorial Trophy was presented in 1953 by the four children of the late **James Norris** in memory of the former owner-president of the Detroit Red Wings.

2019-20 Finalists

John Carlson, Washington Capitals

Carlson helped the Capitals to a first-place finish in the Metropolitan Division for a fifth consecutive season by leading all NHL defensemen in scoring by a 10-point margin, tallying a team- and career-high 15-60—75 in 69 games. He became the NHL’s fifth blueliner in the last 30 years to reach the 50-assist mark in 54 games or fewer and first since **Sergei Zubov** (NYR) in 1993-94. Despite a shortened regular season, his 60 assists were the most by a Capitals defenseman since **Scott Stevens** recorded a franchise-record 61 in 1988-89 and his 75 points were just six fewer than **Larry Murphy**’s record of 23-58—81 set in 1986-87. The 30-year-old native of Natick, Mass., is a Norris finalist for the first time and looks to become the first Capitals player to win the trophy since **Rod Langway** had back-to-back triumphs in 1982-83 and 1983-84.

Victor Hedman, Tampa Bay Lightning

Hedman ranked third among defensemen in scoring with 11-44—55 in 66 games, marking his fourth consecutive season with 40+ assists and 50+ points. During the Lightning’s scorching 23-2-1 run from Dec. 23 through Feb. 17, Hedman posted an even-or-plus rating in 22 of the 26 games (+29 in all) and played an average of 25:43 per contest. Highlights in that span included four assists on Dec. 28 vs. MTL (5-4 W), tying a franchise record for defensemen, and logging a career-high 32:12 on Feb. 15 vs. PHI (5-3 W). The 29-year-old Ornskoldsvik, Sweden, native is the first Norris Trophy finalist in four consecutive seasons since countryman **Nicklas Lidstrom** with the Detroit Red Wings was selected from 2005-06 through 2008-09. Hedman became the first Lightning player to capture Norris honors in 2017-18 and finished third in 2016-17 and 2018-19.

Roman Josi, Nashville Predators

Josi led the Predators in scoring with 16-49—65 in 69 games, joining Carlson as the only defenseman to top his team in points this season. Josi’s 65 points set a franchise record for defensemen, surpassing the 61 he recorded in 2015-16, and his 16 goals marked a career high. The Nashville captain’s 12-game point streak (7-13—20) from Dec. 16-Jan. 9 set another franchise record for defensemen and was the longest by any blueliner since Philadelphia’s **Shayne Gostisbehere** (15 games) in 2015-16. Josi ranked among the top three League defenders in several categories, including shots (1st, 260), points (2nd, 65), goals (t-2nd, 16), assists (2nd, 49) and average time on ice (3rd, 25:47). The 30-year-old Bern, Switzerland, native is a first-time Norris Trophy finalist and is vying to become the first winner in Predators history.

KING CLANCY MEMORIAL TROPHY

Description

First awarded in 1987-88, the King Clancy Memorial Trophy is presented annually “to the player who best exemplifies leadership qualities on and off the ice and has made a noteworthy humanitarian contribution in his community.”

Voting

Each NHL team submits a nominee for the King Clancy Memorial Trophy. The three finalists and ultimate winner are selected by a committee of senior NHL executives led by Commissioner **Gary Bettman** and Deputy Commissioner **Bill Daly**.

The selection committee applies the following criteria in determining the finalists and winner of the award:

- * Clear and measurable positive impact on the community
- * Investment of time and resources
- * Commitment to a particular cause or community
- * Commitment to the League's community initiatives
- * Creativity of programming
- * Use of influence; engagement of others

History

The King Clancy Memorial Trophy was presented in 1988 by the NHL's Board of Governors in honor of **Frank "King" Clancy**, a beloved figure in the League for decades as a player, referee, coach, manager and goodwill ambassador. A three-time Stanley Cup champion and 1958 inductee to the Hockey Hall of Fame, Clancy was voted as one of the 100 Greatest NHL Players during the League's Centennial Celebration in 2017.

Charitable Donations

The King Clancy Memorial Trophy winner receives a \$25,000 donation from the National Hockey League Foundation to benefit a charity or charities of his choice. The two runners-up each receive a \$5,000 donation from the National Hockey League Foundation to benefit a charity or charities of their choice.

2019-20 Finalists

Matt Dumba, D, Minnesota Wild

In response to social unrest across North America and recent stories about racism in hockey, Dumba – along with several other current and former NHL players – co-founded the [Hockey Diversity Alliance](#), which aims to eradicate systemic racism and intolerance in hockey. Dumba, who delivered [a powerful message](#) on the subject during the 2020 Stanley Cup Qualifiers, also spearheaded the [Rebuild Minnesota](#) initiative to assist Minneapolis businesses impacted by riots and protests in the wake of the murder of **George Floyd**. The fundraiser, which aims to raise \$500,000, will donate all funds to [Lake Street Council](#) in Minnesota and [ActionDignity](#) in Canada. Dumba's other efforts during the 2019-20 season included COVID-19 support to more than 60 families who are part of [ACES](#) (Athletes Committed to Educating Students), a surprise [Hockey Fights Cancer](#) tribute for a close family friend and a donation to [Australia wildfire relief efforts](#).

Henrik Lundqvist, G, New York Rangers

Lundqvist and his wife, **Therese**, have raised more than \$3.2 million since the 2014 inception of the [Henrik Lundqvist Foundation](#) (HLF), which benefits [Together for Better](#), [New York Presbyterian Children's Hospital](#), [Ronald McDonald Barnford](#) in Sweden and the [Garden of Dreams Foundation](#) (GDF) as well as HLF's own initiative – the HLF Young Ambassador Program. To date, HLF has directly given grants and made commitments of more than \$1.5 million in support of children's health and education. Lundqvist, who has served as a spokesperson for GDF since 2009, helped that organization raise \$650,000 in 2019-20 alone. He also has been active in COVID-19 relief efforts, auctioning off a game-worn mask that raised \$37,000 via the [All In Challenge](#) and donating \$100,000 through HLF to feed New Yorkers in need. That contribution provided approximately 68,000 meals and aided 8,000 children and their families.

P.K. Subban, D, New Jersey Devils

Subban made a \$50,000 donation to the fundraiser for the daughter of **George Floyd**, whose murder sparked a worldwide movement for societal change. Subban's donation inspired athletes across the sports world to contribute and help the effort far surpass its initial goal, raising more than \$1.5 million. Subban also continued his various charitable initiatives through the [P.K. Subban Foundation](#), which aims to create positive change through building a community of people who are passionate about helping children around the globe. Among those efforts is the [Blueline Buddies](#) program, which brings together local police and youth to attend an NHL game (and meet Subban afterward). In addition to Subban's pledge of \$10 million to the Montreal Children's Hospital, his foundation has created the [Subban Defence League](#) and "[PKSFWEEKMTL](#)," a weeklong fundraiser that generated more than \$500,000 in 2019 and recently took place again in August.

LADY BYNG MEMORIAL TROPHY

Description

First awarded in 1924-25, the Lady Byng Memorial Trophy is presented annually “to the player adjudged to have exhibited the best type of sportsmanship and gentlemanly conduct combined with a high standard of playing ability.”

Voting

Members of the Professional Hockey Writers Association submit ballots for the Lady Byng Memorial Trophy at the conclusion of the regular season, with the top three vote-getters designated as finalists.

History

Lady Byng, wife of Canada’s Governor General at the time, presented the Lady Byng Trophy during the 1924-25 season. After **Frank Boucher** of the New York Rangers won the award seven times in eight seasons, he was given the trophy to keep and Lady Byng donated another trophy in 1936. After Lady Byng’s death in 1949, the NHL presented a new trophy, changing the name to the Lady Byng Memorial Trophy.

2019-20 Finalists

Nathan MacKinnon, C, Colorado Avalanche

MacKinnon ranked fifth in the NHL with 35-58—93 in 69 games, 43 points more than his next-closest teammate, to lead the Avalanche into the playoffs for the third consecutive season. He also placed among the top 10 in the League in power-play points (4th; 31), assists (6th; 58), power-play goals (t-6th; 12), goals (9th; 35) and power-play assists (t-10th; 19), while topping the NHL in shots on goal (318). MacKinnon did so while registering a career-low 12 penalty minutes, the second-fewest among the League’s top 25 scorers; no other NHL forward averaged more time on ice (21:13) in 2019-20 while taking fewer penalties. The 25-year-old Halifax, N.S., native – who also is a 2019-20 Hart Memorial Trophy and Ted Lindsay Award finalist – is a Lady Byng Trophy finalist for the first time. He is seeking to become the third player in Avalanche/Nordiques history to win the award, following **Ryan O'Reilly** in 2013-14 and **Joe Sakic** in 2000-01.

Auston Matthews, C, Toronto Maple Leafs

Matthews finished third in the NHL with a career-high 47 goals, one behind Maurice “Rocket” Richard Trophy co-winners **Alex Ovechkin** and **David Pastrnak**, while also topping the Maple Leafs with a career-best 80 points in 70 games (47-33—80). Matthews – who added personal highs and ranked among the top 10 in the League in shots on goal (4th; 290) and power-play goals (t-6th; 12) – also established a career-low with eight penalty minutes, tied for the fewest among the NHL’s top 100 scorers. He did so while sharing second place in the League in takeaways (78) and ranking eighth among NHL forwards in total time on ice (1,467:52), also both personal bests. The 22-year-old Scottsdale, Ariz., native – who captured the Calder Memorial Trophy in 2016-17 – is vying to become the eighth different player to win the Lady Byng Trophy with the Maple Leafs and just the second to do so in the expansion era (since 1967-68), following **Alexander Mogilny** in 2002-03.

Ryan O'Reilly, C, St. Louis Blues

O'Reilly led the reigning Stanley Cup champion Blues with 12-49—61 in 71 games to power the team to the highest points percentage in the Western Conference (.662; 42-19-10). He topped the NHL in both face-off wins (880) and face-offs taken (1,556), ranking 10th among qualifying players with a 56.6 face-off winning percentage. O'Reilly received five minor penalties (10 PIM), the sixth time in his 11 NHL seasons he has totaled 10 or fewer penalty minutes, while ranking seventh in the League in takeaways (69) and 10th among NHL forwards in total time on ice (1,460:45). The 29-year-old Clinton, Ont., native – who previously won the Lady Byng Trophy in 2013-14 (w/ COL) – is a finalist for the award for the third straight season, following second-place finishes in both 2018-19 (w/ STL) and 2017-18 (w/ BUF). He is looking to become the fourth player to capture the trophy with the Blues, joining **Pavol Demitra** (1999-00), **Brett Hull** (1989-90) and **Phil Goyette** (1969-70).

MARK MESSIER NHL LEADERSHIP AWARD

MAURICE “ROCKET” RICHARD TROPHY

Description

First awarded in 1998-99, the Maurice “Rocket” Richard Trophy is presented annually “to the player finishing the regular season as the League’s goal-scoring leader.”

History

A gift to the NHL from the Montreal Canadiens in 1999, the Maurice “Rocket” Richard Trophy honors one of the game’s greatest stars. During his 18-year career with the Canadiens from 1942-43 through 1959-60, Richard was the first player in NHL history to score 50 goals in a season and 500 in his career. He played on eight Stanley Cup champion teams and led the League in goals five times.

2019-20 Winners

Washington Capitals left wing **Alex Ovechkin** (48-19—67 in 68 GP) topped the NHL in goals for the third straight season and a record ninth time overall, two more than left wing **Bobby Hull** (7x). The Moscow, Russia, native became the eighth member of the NHL’s 700-goal club on Feb. 22 at NJD, making him both the second-youngest (34 years, 158 days) and second-fastest (1,144 GP) player to reach the milestone behind only **Wayne Gretzky** (29 years, 342 days; 886 GP). Ovechkin achieved the feat after compiling four hat tricks earlier in the season, including consecutive three-goal performances Jan. 16 vs. NJD and Jan. 18 at NYI. Since entering the NHL in 2005-06, the Capitals captain has scored 244 more goals than any other player (706-572—1,278 in 1,152 GP). Ovechkin’s career average of 0.61 goals per game ranks fourth in League history among skaters with at least 500 appearances, trailing only **Mike Bossy** (0.76), **Mario Lemieux** (0.75) and **Pavel Bure** (0.62).

Boston Bruins right wing **David Pastrnak** (48-47—95 in 70 GP) powered the team’s offense to earn his first career Maurice “Rocket” Richard Trophy. Pastrnak became the first Bruins player to win the Richard Trophy (which was introduced in 1998-99) and the fifth Boston player to top the NHL in goals (outright or shared), joining **Phil Esposito** (6x, most recently in 1974-75), **Bronco Horvath** (1959-60), **Roy Conacher** (1938-39) and **Cooney Weiland** (1929-30). Pastrnak, who also paced the League with 20 power-play goals and 10 game-winning tallies (tied), produced eight multi-goal performances, highlighted by four hat tricks and a career-high four goals Oct. 14 vs. ANA. The 24-year-old Havirov, Czech Republic, native – who scored the most goals by any Bruins player since 1993-94 (**Cam Neely**: 50) – became the youngest Richard Trophy winner since Tampa Bay Lightning center **Steven Stamkos** in 2011-12 (22 years, 60 days).

The Boston Bruins (44-14-12 in 70 GP) topped the NHL in both points (100) and points percentage (.714) to claim their third Presidents' Trophy, adding to wins in 2013-14 and 1989-90. (They also finished first in the NHL standings 11 times before the Presidents' Trophy was introduced in 1985-86.) Boston finished ahead of its 2019 Stanley Cup Final opponent, the St. Louis Blues (42-19-10, 94 points), on the strength of a League-best 44 wins, including 22 victories as both hosts (22-4-9) and visitors (22-10-3). The Bruins, who reached the 40-win milestone for the seventh consecutive season, also posted an NHL-best +53 goal differential while ranking in the top three in both power play (2nd; 25.2%) and penalty kill (3rd; 84.3%) efficiency.

TED LINDSAY AWARD

Description

First awarded in 1970-71 (as the Lester B. Pearson Award), the Ted Lindsay Award is presented annually “to the most outstanding player as voted by fellow members of the NHLPA.”

History

The Ted Lindsay Award is the only NHL Trophy voted on by the players themselves, carrying on the tradition established by the Lester B. Pearson Award in 1970-71. Reintroduced in 2009-10, the Ted Lindsay Award honors its namesake, a Hockey Hall of Famer known for his skill, tenacity, leadership and role in establishing the NHLPA.

2019-20 Finalists

Leon Draisaitl, C, Edmonton Oilers

Draisaitl played in all 71 of Edmonton's regular-season games as he helped lead the Oilers to the fifth-best points percentage in the Western Conference. The 24-year-old forward of Germany (Cologne, North Rhine-Westphalia) led the NHL in points per game (1.55), assists (67), power-play points (44) and average ice time among forwards (22:37), while he tied for first in game-winning goals (10). Draisaitl topped all scorers with 110 points – the first German-born player to win the Art Ross Trophy. He also finished second in both even-strength points (66) and power-play goals (16), and he placed fourth in goals (43) on the season. Draisaitl is looking to become the first German recipient of the TLA, and follow teammate **Connor McDavid**'s recent run of back-to-back awards (2016-17, 2017-18).

Nathan MacKinnon, C, Colorado Avalanche

MacKinnon played in 69 of Colorado's 70 regular-season games to help the Avalanche secure the second-best regular-season points percentage in the Western Conference. The 25-year-old forward of Canada (Halifax, Nova Scotia) paced all NHL players in shots on goal (318). His 93 points ranked fifth in League scoring, 43 points ahead of his closest teammate. MacKinnon placed third in even-strength points (62), fourth in power-play points (31) and tied for fifth in points per game (1.35). A model of offensive consistency, he has scored at least 35 goals and 90 points while also recording exactly 58 assists for three seasons in a row. Now a two-time TLA finalist, MacKinnon looks to join **Joe Sakic** (2000-01) as the second Avalanche player to receive the award.

Artemi Panarin, LW, New York Rangers

Panarin played in 69 of New York's 70 regular-season games while he helped lead the Rangers to a place in the Qualifying Round after tying for the fifth-most standings points (37) since Jan. 1. The 28-year-old forward of Russia (Korkino, Chelyabinsk Oblast) led all NHL players in even-strength points (71), tied for second in assists (63), tied for third in points (95 points) and placed third in points per game (1.38). He twice recorded point streaks of at least 12 games in 2019-20 (19 points in 12 GP, Oct. 24 – Nov. 20; 19 points in 13 GP, Feb. 7 – March 1). Panarin is the first Rangers player to be voted as a finalist since **Henrik Lundqvist** (2011-12), and he is looking to become the first Rangers recipient in 14 years (**Jaromir Jagr** in 2005-06).

VEZINA TROPHY

Description

First awarded in 1926-27, the Vezina Trophy is presented annually “to the goaltender adjudged to be the best at his position.” Before the 1981-82 season, the goaltender(s) of the team allowing the fewest number of goals during the regular season – the current criteria for the William M. Jennings Trophy – won the Vezina Trophy.

Voting

The general managers of the NHL’s 31 teams submit ballots for the Vezina Trophy at the conclusion of the regular season, with the top three vote-getters designated as finalists.

History

Leo Dandurand, Louis Letourneau and **Joe Catarinich**, former owners of the Montreal Canadiens, presented the trophy to the NHL in 1926-27 in memory of **Georges Vezina**, the outstanding Canadiens goaltender who collapsed during a game on Nov. 28, 1925, and died of tuberculosis a few months later.

2019-20 Finalists

Connor Hellebuyck, Winnipeg Jets

Hellebuyck (31-21-5, 2.57 GAA, .922 SV%) backstopped the Jets to a place in the Western Conference Stanley Cup Qualifiers as the No. 9-ranked team, leading all goaltenders in games (t-58), shots faced (1,796), saves (1,656) and shutouts (6). He ranked second overall in starts (56), wins (31) and minutes (3,268:33). The 27-year-old Commerce, Mich., native recorded 31 of the 37 Jets wins (83.8%), the second-highest percentage among goaltenders on the 24 teams that participated in the Stanley Cup Qualifiers. Hellebuyck faced 37-or-more shots on 13 occasions and posted a 10-1-2 record, 2.08 GAA and .949 SV% in those contests, including a career-high 51 saves in a 3-2 win at San Jose Nov. 1 in which the Jets were outshot 53-19. Hellebuyck is a Vezina Trophy finalist for the second time in three seasons (2nd in 2017-18) and is seeking to become the first goaltender in Jets/Thrashers history to capture the award.

Tuukka Rask, Boston Bruins

Rask (26-8-6, 2.12 GAA, .929 SV%) helped the Bruins win the Presidents’ Trophy as the NHL’s top-ranked team during the regular season and combined with **Jaroslav Halak** to win the William M. Jennings Trophy as the goaltenders on the team allowing the fewest regular-season goals. Rask led the NHL in goals-against average, ranked second in save percentage and shared second place in shutouts (5). He became the third goaltender in NHL history to post a 20-game home point streak to start the season (14-0-6) and recorded his eighth 20-win campaign, joining Bruins legends **Tiny Thompson, Frank Brimsek** and **Gerry Cheevers**. The Savonlinna, Finland, native reached the 50-shutout career milestone on March 10, his 33rd birthday, stopping 36 shots in a 2-0 win over Philadelphia. Rask, who captured the Vezina Trophy in 2013-14, is vying for his second win in as many appearances as a finalist.

Andrei Vasilevskiy, Tampa Bay Lightning

Highlighted by a 21-game point streak (19-0-2) over a two-month period, Vasilevskiy posted an NHL-best 35 wins in 2019-20 (35-14-3, 2.56 GAA, .917 SV%), marking the third consecutive season he has led or tied for the League lead in the category. He won 21 of his last 27 starts (21-5-1) from Dec. 23 through the pause in play on March 11, helping the Lightning jump from the ninth-best points percentage in the Eastern Conference (.559, 17-13-4) to second-best (.657, 43-21-6). That run included a personal 10-game winning streak at AMALIE Arena from Dec. 23 – Feb. 15 (1.89 GAA, .937 SV%), becoming the first goaltender in franchise history to post a double-digit home win streak. Overall, Vasilevskiy ranked third in starts (t-52), minutes (3,121:54), shots faced (1,605) and saves (1,472). The 26-year-old Tyumen, Russia, native is the reigning Vezina Trophy winner and a finalist for the third consecutive season (3rd in 2017-18).

WILLIAM M. JENNINGS TROPHY

Description

First awarded in 1981-82, the William M. Jennings Trophy is presented annually "to the goaltender(s) having played a minimum of 25 games for the team(s) with the fewest goals scored against it."

History

The William M. Jennings Trophy was presented in 1981-82 by the NHL's Board of Governors in honor of the late **William M. Jennings**, longtime governor and president of the New York Rangers and one of the great builders of hockey in the United States.

Until the 1980-81 season, the Vezina Trophy was awarded to the goaltender(s) of the team(s) allowing the fewest number of goals during the regular season.

2019-20 Winners

Tuukka Rask (41 GP, 26-8-6, 2.12 GAA, .929 SV%, 5 SO) and **Jaroslav Halak** (31 GP, 18-6-6, 2.39 GAA, .919 SV%, 3 SO) combined to help the Boston Bruins claim their third William M. Jennings Trophy, following wins in 2008-09 (**Tim Thomas** and **Manny Fernandez**) and 1989-90 (**Andy Moog** and **Reggie Lemelin**). Boston allowed a League-low 174 goals in 70 contests, three fewer than its closest competitor despite playing one more game (DAL: 177 GA in 69 GP). Rask, who earned his first Jennings Trophy, led the NHL in goals-against average (2.12), ranked second in save percentage (.929) and shared second place in shutouts (5). Halak, who won the Jennings Trophy for the second time (also 2011-12 w/ STL), placed sixth in the League in goals-against average (2.39). The duo combined to backstop the Bruins to an NHL-high eight shutouts (one more than both CBJ and NSH) and a League-best .921 team save percentage.

WILLIE O'REE COMMUNITY HERO AWARD

Description

First awarded in 2017-18, the Willie O'Ree Community Hero Award is presented annually "to an individual who – through the game of hockey – has positively impacted his or her community, culture or society."

Voting

Fans submit candidates for the Willie O'Ree Community Hero Award, with **Willie O'Ree** – in consultation with the NHL – narrowing the field to three finalists. The public then votes for the ultimate winner.

History

The Willie O'Ree Community Hero Award honors former NHL forward **Willie O'Ree**, who on Jan. 18, 1958, became the first black player to compete in the League. O'Ree, who lost sight in his right eye at a young age, went on to play professional hockey for 21 years. His perseverance is unrivaled, and his impact on the game and the lives of young players still is felt today. For more than two decades, O'Ree has served as the NHL's Diversity Ambassador, traveling across North America to schools and hockey programs to share his story and experiences as well as to promote messages of inclusion, dedication and confidence. O'Ree has used hockey as a platform to build character and teach life skills, and has used his influence to foster positive values through the sport.

2019-20 Finalists

Dampy Brar, Apna Hockey (Calgary, Alberta)

Brar, alongside **Lali Toor**, co-founded [Apna Hockey](#), an initiative that provides a network and support for South Asian hockey players. A former professional hockey player himself, playing in both the International Hockey League and the West Coast Hockey League, Brar works tirelessly to mentor and teach youth hockey, including coaching his own children's teams. Brar was the first child on both sides of his family to be born outside of India and continues to play a major role in bringing hockey to his family's native country. He worked with **Hayley Wickenheiser** and the Wickfest team in 2018 to bring the first-ever women's hockey team to Canada from Leh Ladakh, India, where he travelled with the team to provide mentorship and support as an advocate for women's hockey. Brar revisited Leh Ladakh in 2019 to watch the women's team and provide them the support that female hockey players in India often do not receive. During that time, he also made a trip to a college in Punjab, India, to mentor students of a roller hockey program.

Alexandria Briggs-Blake, Tucker Road Ducks Hockey (Oxon Hill, Maryland)

[The Tucker Road Ducks](#) are a predominantly African American ice hockey team in Maryland that suffered a devastating fire in 2017, which left their rink destroyed and their team without a place to play. Briggs-Blake, president of the Tucker Road Parent Hockey Organization (TRPHO) and mother of former Tucker Road Ducks players, used her passion for hockey to rally her community together to build a new rink. Through her leadership and advocacy efforts, more than \$20 million was secured and a new rink is projected to be completed by February 2021. Briggs-Blake knows the lasting impact hockey can have on kids and does everything she can to provide access to the sport, including providing full sets of equipment for players, and – through a partnership with the Parks and Planning committee (M-NCPPC) – offers low registration fees and accommodations for families who are unable to afford those fees. A community hero, ally, friend, mentor and mother, Briggs-Blake is an inspiration to the hockey community. She remains dedicated to the sport and has made it her mission to continue spreading her love for hockey and recruiting new players to the Tucker Road Ducks.

John Haferman, Columbus Ice Hockey Club (Columbus, Ohio)

Haferman is the co-founder of the [Columbus Ice Hockey Club \(CIHC\)](#), an organization dedicated to developing life and leadership skills in youth from some of Central Ohio's most diverse and underserved populations. Over the past three decades, more than 30,000 kids, many of whom would have never had the chance to see or experience hockey in their lives, have been brought together through the program to develop core values to use for the rest of their lives. With Haferman's leadership and more than \$300,000 in disseminated scholarships, the CIHC supports and encourages participants off the ice to pursue education and become career-focused citizens. In 2019, Haferman partnered with local sled and special-needs hockey programs to offer a Try Hockey For Free clinic designed for athletes with visual impairments, resulting in a new hockey organization. Haferman continues to use hockey to build equality within communities, including wounded veterans, people with disabilities, and members of the LGBTQ populations in his quest to prove hockey is for everyone.

CLARENCE S. CAMPBELL BOWL

Description

First awarded in 1967-68, the Clarence S. Campbell Bowl is presented annually “to the Western Conference team that advances to the Stanley Cup Final.”

History

The Clarence S. Campbell Bowl was presented by the NHL’s Member Clubs in 1968 for perpetual competition by the League in recognition of the services of **Clarence S. Campbell**, NHL President from 1946-77. From 1967-68 through 1973-74, the trophy was awarded to the regular-season champion of the West Division. Beginning in 1974-75, it was presented to the regular-season winner of the conference bearing the name of the trophy. From 1981-82 to 1992-93, the trophy was given to the playoff champion in the Campbell Conference. Since 1993-94, the trophy has been awarded to the playoff champion in the Western Conference. The trophy itself is a hallmark piece made of sterling silver that was crafted by a British silversmith in 1878.

PRINCE OF WALES TROPHY

Description

First awarded in 1925-26, the Prince of Wales Trophy is presented annually “to the Eastern Conference team that advances to the Stanley Cup Final.”

History

His Royal Highness, the Prince of Wales, donated the trophy to the NHL in 1925. It originally was awarded to the winner of the first game played in Madison Square Garden on Dec. 15, 1925 (MTL 3 at NYA 1). It then was awarded to the NHL playoff champion in 1925-26 and 1926-27. From 1927-28 through 1937-38, the award was presented to the regular-season champion of the American Division of the NHL. (The team finishing first in the Canadian Division received the O'Brien Trophy during these years.) From 1938-39, when the NHL reverted to one section, to 1966-67, it was presented to the team winning the NHL regular-season championship. With expansion in 1967-68, it again became a divisional trophy, awarded to the regular-season champions of the East Division through the 1973-74 season. Beginning in 1974-75, it was awarded to the regular-season winner of the conference bearing the name of the trophy. From 1981-82 to 1992-93, the trophy was presented to the playoff champion in the Wales Conference. Since 1993-94, the trophy has been presented to the playoff champion in the Eastern Conference.

STANLEY CUP

Description

Perhaps the most famous trophy in all of sports, the Stanley Cup is awarded annually to the National Hockey League champion. The trophy, which has changed in size and shape over the years, is almost 3 feet tall and weighs nearly 35 pounds. Unique among North American team sports, each member of the winning team has his or her name inscribed on the Stanley Cup.

History

The Stanley Cup – the oldest trophy competed for by professional athletes in North America – was donated by **Frederick Arthur**, Lord Stanley of Preston and son of the Earl of Derby, in 1893. Lord Stanley purchased the trophy for 10 guineas (\$50 at the time) for presentation to the amateur hockey champions of Canada. Since 1906, when Canadian teams began to openly pay their players, the Stanley Cup has been the symbol of professional hockey supremacy. It has been contested only by NHL teams since 1926-27 and has been under the exclusive control of the NHL since 1947.
